

Dear Parents/Carers

The purpose of this letter is to outline arrangements and support for Year 13 students as they head towards their final exams and submission dates for coursework. Students continue to receive feedback, advice and guidance from their subject teachers during lessons in these weeks before the exams and departments are offering additional support outside lessons. We have included a recent copy of the weekly Sixth Form diary, which gives details of when this support is available at lunchtimes and after school. Year 13 students continue to have regular mentoring meetings with their form tutors to discuss future plans and choices.

We would like to take this opportunity to give you details of all the forthcoming key events and dates for the remainder of this Academic Year.

- Thursday 3 May – Deadline for accepting university offers through UCAS (if all offers were received before 31 March). The UCAS website offers detailed advice for students and parents but if you have any queries do not hesitate to contact us.
- Friday 18 May – Final teaching day for Year 13 students.
- Monday 21 –
Friday 25 May – Exam Preparation Week: targeted Year 13 students required to attend revision sessions as informed by subject teacher. Year 13 students may study at home during this week with subject teacher permission. The Sixth Form Centre shall be open as normal.
- Friday 25 May – Deadline to apply for Student Finance to guarantee payment for start of Academic Year 2018/19.
- Monday 4 June – Majority of A level exams begin. All students have been given an individual examination timetable.
- Friday 22 June – Summer Ball in aid of Cystic Fibrosis Trust. The event shall take place at the Sixth Form Centre between 6pm – 10pm. Tickets £20 with all proceeds going to the CF Trust.
- Thursday 16 August – Results Day. Staff will be available to advise students.
- Friday 17 August – Staff will be available for advice from 10.00 am.

We hope this letter has helped to clarify the weeks ahead – there is certainly a lot to take in.
